# City Council Update

The March meeting began with a farewell Invocation delivered by Pastor Dick Kammerzell with the Church of God Holiness. Pastor Kammerzell has always been an inspiration to the City with his encouraging spiritual guidance. His retirement takes him and his wife back to family and farm living.

During the Council meeting of March 26<sup>th</sup> the City Councilor's took action on the following agenda items:

- > Approving the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program for the 2015-2016 Budget
- > Approved a request from the Rogue River Greenway to waive the reservation fee for Palmerton Park to hold the annual "Ride the Rogue" on Saturday, September 19, 2015
- Approved a request from the Elk Mountain Games to hang a banner across Depot Street from March 27 to May 4, 2015
- Approved a request from the Rogue Outreach Center to waive the business license fee for the Culpepper & Meriweather Circus to perform on May 21, 2015 with proceeds benefiting the ROC
- > Appointed Carolyn Riley to the Sign Review Board
- > Appointed Cindy England as an Alternate to the Planning Commission
- > Declared surplus property from the waste water treatment plant
- Mayor Pam VanArsdale read a Proclamation declaring April 10, 2015 as the day to celebrate Arbor Day in the City of Rogue River, encouraging everyone to plant a tree

Staff has been preparing the 2015-2016 Budget. On Thursday, April 9, 2015 at 4:00 p.m. they will meet with the Mayor, City Council and Budget Committee Members to review, take public comment and eventually approve the 2015-2016 annual Budget. If you are interested in the Budget process, this meeting is open to the public and visitors are always welcome.

The 62<sup>nd</sup> National Rooster Crowing Contest is quickly approaching. Applications are available for the Parade, Fun Walk Run and Car Show at City Hall, Umpqua Bank, and the Chamber of Commerce building located on the Rogue River Highway and the Chambers web-site. Commercial booths are available at City Hall at a cost of \$100 for every 12' x 12' space of ground for you to sell your handmade or wholesale goods, to advertise your company, prepare your favorite foods. # **MAYOR'S CORNER**

At the risk of sounding a bit like Chicken Little, I'd like to talk about emergency preparedness some more.



I watched a short You Tube video a few weeks ago about the likelihood of a catastrophic earthquake in our region (a link to that video is available on the city's website under public notices) and it pointed out that natural disasters, whether it's earthquake, forest fire or floods, are a certainty but survival is optional. In other words, survival will depend on how well prepared we, as individuals, and as a community are for such an emergency. Small things such as buying an extra can of food and a gallon of bottled water when you go grocery shopping could be a start. It was suggested that a 30 day supply of food and water could be necessary if a large earthquake does occur.

On a lighter note, we'll be celebrating Arbor Day here in the City on Friday, April 10<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to the tireless efforts of Anna Classick, Rogue River became a Tree City in 1984. I hope you'll join me at Palmerton Park that day at 10:30 AM for our annual tree planting ceremony with the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade class of Rogue River Elementary School.
