

I spent last weekend at the annual Oregon Mayor's Association conference. There was a lot of discussion about disaster planning and some good ideas shared from the other cities who participated in last month's Cascadia Rising exercise. The conference was held on the coast, where they're not only concerned about the Cascadia earthquake but also the tsunami that the quake will cause. The scenarios were pretty sobering and I urge anyone that visits the coast to take a little time before their trip to research where the hazard zones are and know the evacuation routes. Also, no matter where you travel to, having a basic emergency kit in your car is as important as having a spare tire.

We've finally finished the bid process for the remainder of our street improvement projects so you can expect to see that work getting started soon. Third Street, Placer Street, and Nugget Drive are just a few of the streets that are going to see some major repair, so watch out for the construction crews and please be patient through any inconvenience these projects may cause. Summer Paving Projects



Construction will begin in August on the final phase of street work under the voter approved street improvement bond and will include pavement overlays, crack sealing, chip sealing and seal coating. The work is scheduled to be completed by the end of October. The construction is scheduled in the daytime starting at 7:00 am. **Drivers should anticipate local detours and delays. Please allow additional travel time and drive safely.**

Mail and trash service will continue. If your mailbox is inaccessible at the time of delivery, your mail may be held and delivered the following day. Southern Oregon Sanitation customers are requested to have your carts for both Garbage and Recycle out the night before. They will be servicing the construction area **first thing Wednesday mornings** which will affect that area and may effect pick up times for other areas of the city.
