<u>City Council Update</u>

- The May 2016 City Council meeting was opened with an Invocation from Pastor Steve Keeton with Calvary Chapel. They had one of their longest agenda's this month which went smoothly and business dealt with favorably. Due to the business on the agenda they held three different public hearings. The agenda consisted of the following items with City Councils actions:
- Adopted an Ordinance amending the RRMC Chapters 17.30 and 17.50 Zoning regulations to include Marijuana related businesses as a conditional use in the commercial and industrial zones after holding a public hearing for citizen's comments.
- Adopted a Resolution certifying the municipal services for the 2016-2017 budget year
- Adopted a Resolution authorizing funds to be used in the financial management of the City for the 2016-2017 budget year
- Adopted a Resolution extending Workers' Compensation coverage to volunteers for the 2016-2017 budget year
- Adopted a Resolution declaring the City's election to receive State Revenue Sharing for the 2016-2017 budget years after holding a public hearing for citizen comments
- Adopted a Resolution adopting the budget, making appropriations, and levying taxes for the 2016-2017 budget year
- Approved a requested after holding a public hearing to allow property located outside of the City limits to hook up to water and sewer services and authorized the Mayor to sign Annexations Agreements (to facilitate the hook ups)
- Authorized the Mayor to sign the Allocation Certification Agreement Maintenance Assistance Program (MAP) Grant for fiscal year 2016-2017 (this is money the City receives to maintain the boat ramps on the Rogue River)
- Authorized the Mayor to sign an OLCC change of ownership application for the Rogue River Liquor & Smoke Store at 502 East Main Street Authorized the Mayor to sign an OLCC new Outlet application for the Homestead Pub & Whetstone Grill at 117 & 119 East Main Street

Authorized the Mayor to sign an OLCC Temporary Use of an annual license application for the Cattlemen's Saloon along with approving a request to waive the application fee for holding a fund raiser during the Rooster Crow Weekend

- Agreed to co-host a hospitality room with other Southern Oregon Cities at the League of Oregon Cities Conference in September 2016 representing the communities of the Rogue Valley
- Declared a 1997 Ford Ranger as surplus property and directed staff on disposal
- Held an Executive Session with the City Attorney to discuss the legal rights and duties of staff, the Mayor and City Council regarding current litigation or litigation likely to be filed.

The next City Council meeting will be held on Thursday, June 23, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. Workshops will be held on Thursday, June 2nd and 16th at 10:00 a.m. These meetings are open to the public and the Mayor and City Council are always hoping to hear from you, the citizens about the items on the agenda. *Attend and make your selves heard!*

MAYOR'S CORNER

For those of you who couldn't attend the Memorial Day ceremony at Woodville Cemetery, I thought I'd share the speech that I gave with you.

Across the nation this Memorial Day, we gather to honor those men and women who gave their lives on battlefields, far and wide, both foreign and domestic. In cemeteries, large and small, and no matter how remote, are the stones and the markers of the last resting places of these honored dead.

The World War I poem "In Flanders Fields", By Canadian soldier John McCrea, inspired the Memorial Day custom of wearing red cloth poppies. A Georgia teacher and volunteer war worker, Moina Michael, started a campaign in 1915 to make the poppy a symbol of tribute to veterans and in her words for "keeping the faith with all who died". The annual distribution of Buddy Poppies by the Rogue River Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4116 and the Ladies Auxiliary is eloquently reflected in the desire to "Honor the Dead by Helping the Living". As stated by Abraham Lincoln, it is our duty "to care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and his orphan". These men and women who gave "their last full measure of devotion" were sons and daughters, husbands and wives, mothers and fathers, and in remembering them, we must also remember those they left behind.

He also stated that it was the job of the living to "take increased devotion to that cause" for which they gave that last full measure. There are those that sometimes take for granted the freedoms that these brave individuals fought and died for, but it only takes a few minutes of watching the evening news to see how fortunate we truly are. As we go back to our homes today, enjoying backyard barbecues and leisure time with families, there are many around the world that live in abject poverty, in war-torn countries, and with little hope of a struggle free existence. The preservation of our freedom and our way of life is not just the duty of our soldiers but must be undertaken by all citizens.

John F. Kennedy said "As we express our gratitude, we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not to utter words, but to live by them."
