# City Council Update

Mayor Pam VanArsdale opened the February City Council meeting by welcoming the new Grace Baptist Church Pastor, Charlie Granade to Rogue River. After hearing the committee reports the City Council checked off the following agenda items:

- ✓ Approved the first reading to amend Ordinance RRMC 10.05.130 for Storage of Motor Vehicles on City streets
- ✓ Approved a Resolution transferring appropriation authority within the Water Fund, for the Budget year beginning July 1, 2015
- ✓ Held a Public Hearing to consider an application for a Tentative Plat approval for a proposed subdivision on Foothill Boulevard
- ✓ Approved the Tentative Plat for a proposed subdivision for property on Foothill Boulevard for eight new parcels to accommodate sixteen new housing units
- ✓ The City Council served as a Contract Review Board a contract for engineering services for the 2016 Pedestrian Improvement Project, authorizing the Mayor to sign a contract with Civil West Engineering Services
- ✓ Accepted the 2015-2015 Audit Report as presented by KDP Certified Public Accountants, LLP
- ✓ Authorized the Mayor to sign a Nonexclusive Temporary Use Permit with Pacifcorp for the use of property where the horseshoe

- courts are located at John F. Fleming Memorial Park
- ✓ Appointed Planning Commission Alternate Dean Stirm to Position No. 3 of the Planning Commission
- ✓ Authorized the Mayor to sign an OLCC Temporary Use of Annual License to hold a fundraiser on March 12, 2016 for Breast Cancer designating the Connie Fiske Breast Cancer Foundation through Asante
- ✓ Approved to declare an OCE copier with extras as surplus property
- ✓ Approved to donate the surplus property of an OCE copier with extras to the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Rogue River Post 4116

Other discussion during the meeting included an update on a Senate Bill issue doing away with the City's option of requiring Voter Approval Annexation. This Ordinance was approved by the citizens in 1999 requiring that property annexed into the city limits is done so only by a vote of the people. The Mayor and City Council will continue their research on this particular matter to assure our citizens that the regulations they voted to put into place are still valuable.

REMEMBER: The City Council and Planning Commission meetings are always open to the public and your elected and appointed officials are always happy to see citizens being active members of the audience. Please join us at our next meeting.

#### PLEASE KEEP "FLUSHABLE" WIPES OUT OF PIPES

Sometimes we forget the toilet is not a trash can. All wipes, disposable cleaning and so called "flushable" products belong in the trash, not the toilet. Did you know flushing wipes down the toilet causes problems in the City' sewer system? Those "disposable" wipes may be labeled "flushable", but they can clog the sewer system, contributing to costly cleanups and may result in sewage backups.

Over the last year the City has experienced a substantial increase in costly wastewater pump station malfunctions. Crews are regularly unclogging mounds of rags and wipes from pumps, at considerable expense, and the potential for environmental consequences could be raw sewage backing up into your or a neighbor's plumbing.

Common Offenders: ♦ Disinfecting wipes ♦ Swiffer mop refills ♦ Toss-in toilet bowl wands

◆ Shop towels/rags ◆ Towelettes ◆ Baby and Senior diapers and wipes ◆ Paper towels

Many cleaning products are labeled "flushable" or "disposable," but they often don't dissolve or break down after being flushed. A general guideline is, if it doesn't dissolve as fast as toilet paper, it's NOT FLUSHABLE.

Please help us keep costs down and keep the sewer system flowing by placing these materials where they belong: in the trash.
