
- agreement with Landscape Architect Galbraith & Associates Approved a request to waive the Liquor

#### **UTILITY DEPARTMENT NOTICE:**

The water and sewer bill that you are receiving this month has been increased by 3.0%. That is a total of \$1.25 for a single family household base rate. For those customers with water service only the increase is .45 cents a month and sewer only customers is .80 cents a month. The increase was determined by the November 2016 Engineering News Record (ENR) Report by averaging the Construction Cost Index, Building Cost Index and Materials Cost Index. The City reviews other cities utility fees but does not do rate comparisons because each city has to consider their infrastructure, costs to run the facilities, population and funding when setting their rates. The City Council realized that the past cost increases were not keeping up with the increase cost of running both the water and sewer systems and made the hard decision to step up and do the right thing. If you have any questions or concerns about your bill please contact the Utility Department at City Hall.

## **Mayor's State of The City Address**

2016 brought continued signs of an improved economy to our city. We saw numerous improvements to many of our commercial buildings and some of the once empty storefronts now boast new businesses. Construction of new homes stayed brisk with 25 building permits issued this past year.

We nearly completed the street improvements project that we've been working on for a couple of years, and by the time it is finished, we will have done some repair to practically every street in the city.

Although we wished them well in their retirements, it was hard to say goodbye to Police Chief Ken Lewis and Public Works Director John Krawczyk. Corporal Chris Snyder was ready to step up into the Chief's position, and with the hiring of two new officers, we ended the year with a fully staffed police department and we hope to have the Public Works Director position filled soon.

Last June, nearly 200 young people from all across the country spent their first week of summer vacation here in Rogue River as volunteers with the World Changers organization. They spent the entire week (which was one of the hottest of the summer), painting, constructing, landscaping, and doing various other improvement projects for community members in need. They were an inspiration and a joy to behold and I look forward to seeing them return this year.

Planning for the improvements to the park where Rooster Crow is held will begin soon, thanks to a State Parks planning grant. Once we have a plan in place, we'll apply for another State Parks grant to pay for the construction of those improvements and it's my hope to have it completed before Rooster Crow 2018.

As we look forward to a new year, the City Council, City Staff and I will continue to work with unified purpose, always striving to be fiscally responsible yet still provide the services that our citizens have come to expect and most certainly deserve. In closing, I would like to thank all those in our community that volunteer, whether it be on a committee or commission, part of a Chamber of Commerce work group, or at the VFW, Community and Visitor's Centers, your time and efforts help to make Rogue River "The finest small city in Southern Oregon"
