City Council Update ...

The June 2017 meeting began with an invocation delivered by Pastor Evan Goeglein with Faith Lutheran Church and followed with the Mayor leading everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The first item on the agenda was to swear in the City's newest Reserve Officer Chad Gray. Chad came just in time to get his feet wet during the Rooster Crow weekend.

Other items on the agenda included:

- ♦ A Resolution authorizing the issuance and negotiated sale of full faith and credit refunding obligations to refund outstanding loans; designating an authorized representative, special counsel, and underwriter; authorizing the execution and delivery of a financing agreement and trust agreement; and related maters.
- ♦ Authorized the Mayor to sign a 2017-2018 Maintenance Assistance Program (MAP) grant.
- ◊ Approved a request from the Rogue River Veterans of Foreign Wars & Auxiliary to hang a banner over Depot Street for the "12th Annual Patriots Run" on September 9, 2017.

\Diamond Adopted the final summary of the Rooster Park Master Plan as presented by Galbraith and Associates including cost estimates for the park layout which included equipment and structures.

♦ The Mayor ended the meeting reading the annual Proclamation declaring June 23-25, 2017 as a time for people of all ages to celebrate the "64th National Rooster Crowing Contest" weekend in the City of Rogue River, congratulating Lawrence Martin for being chosen as this years Grand Marshal along with providing a 24-hour amnesty for all roosters attired in their finest plumage to crow to their hearts content without fear of retribution.

The Mayor, City Councilors and Staff want's to congratulate the "Rogue River Kiwanis" and the "Chamber of Commerce for another successful "National Rooster Crowing Contest" weekend.



When is the Best Time to Water?

With the advent of drought, heat waves, and water restrictions, it is now more important then ever to use water in the most efficient and effective manner when watering your lawn. In order to do this, it is important to understand the obstacles to doing so: high heat, evaporation, wind, lawn diseases, and politicians (water restrictions). So here are a few guidelines you can follow:



How would you like to improve your lawn? Make it greener? Eliminate patches? Less weeds? Make it thicker?

Always try to water your lawn in the early morning. By early morning, I'm referring to around 5:00 a.m.! This is the BEST time for watering, bar none. Early morning watering is best due to: the lack of evaporation that takes place, low winds that can blow you lawn dry, high humidity and morning dew that adds to the moisture. Early morning watering helps to prevent lawn diseases that can be caused by watering at night because it gives your lawn time to dry by night fall. Obviously, this can be best accomplished with a sprinkler system, unless you just can't sleep, especially during the summer months. If you have just planted a new lawn, you will usually need to water once a day so the seeds can germinate and a good solid root system can form. On average, this can last from 2-8 weeks, depending on the type and grass and season.

Try watering a day before mowing if you plan on mowing your lawn and hate the browning that forms on the crowns (tips) of the grass afterwards. This will allow your lawn to recover from the cutting and help it to look nicer as a result.



If you have recently fertilized your lawn, especially with a granular (dry) fertilizer, then you may want to water a few extra times, especially during dry and hot summer months. This can help the fertilizer take hold and aid in preventing the fertilizer from "burning" the grass.
