City Council Update

Mayor Pam VanArsdale opened the February City Council meeting by welcoming Pastor Dan O'Donnell from Crossroads Church Calvarv delivered the Invocation. After hearing the Committee reports the City Council dealt with the following agenda items:

- Adopted a Resolution supporting the 2017 Oregon Legislative Assembly's promulgation to restore recreational immunity rights

It's hard to believe that Spring is just a few weeks away. I'm never ready for really hot weather, but I'm certainly ready to see this winter fade into the past!

I heard that some people were offended by the banner that was hung for the Connie Fiske Foundation fundraiser this month. Please know that the slogan is part of a national campaign to raise money for research and screening and to bring awareness to the fact that breast cancer kills both men and women. Here are some chilling figures from the CDC (Centers for Disease Control):

In 2013 (the most recent year numbers are available) — 230,815 women and 2,109 men in the United States were diagnosed with breast cancer. 40,860 women and 464 men in the United States died from breast cancer.

Next week Councilors Don Dougherty and Shelli Spencer and I are going to attend a disaster preparedness event in Medford that is being put on by the Red Cross. It's called "Prepare Out Loud" and should be both informative and interesting (and probably a bit scary too). As I've said many times, the more prepared we can be as a community for any natural or manmade disaster, the better our survival rate will be. We could probably get the Red Cross to come to Rogue River with this presentation if enough folks are interested, so please let us know by calling City Hall or me.

It took a while to complete, but it's great to see the new sidewalks on both sides of the Wards Creek Bridge. It should be much easier now for those with walkers, wheelchairs and scooters to get across the bridge.
