Your "City Council's Update"

The Mayor was honored to present the "Mayor's Beautification Award" to Julie Atkinson, owner of the LeFleur Bouquet located at 122 Depot Street, for the makeover of the building including the unique chandeliers hanging from the trees. Mayor Pam expressed her gratitude to Julie for dressing up the entrance to Rogue River.

The City Council took action on the following items during their May 2017 meeting:

♦ Adopted a Resolution certifying the municipal services provided by the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2017-2018 budget year.

♦ The City Council heard no comments from the public regarding the use of State Revenue Sharing Funds for fiscal year 2017-2018.

♦ Adopted a Resolution declaring the City's election to receive State Revenue Sharing for the 2017-2018 budget year for the City of Rogue River, Oregon.

♦ Adopted a Resolution extending Workers' Compensation Coverage to volunteers of the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2017-2018 budget year.

♦ Adopted a Resolution authorizing funds to be used in the financial management of the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2017-2018 budget year.

♦ Adopted a Resolution adopting the budget, making appropriations, and levying taxes for the City of Rogue River, Oregon, for the 2017-2018 budget year.

♦ Authorize the Mayor to sign a Telecommunications Contract between the City of Rogue River, Oregon, and Emergency Communications of Southern Oregon for the purpose of implementing a primary 911 Public Safety Answering Point.

♦ Authorize the Mayor to sign an Engagement Letter between the City of Rogue River, Oregon, and D. A. Davidson &

Company for the purpose to serve as an underwriter for USDA Refunding Bonds, Series 2017.

♦ Approved a request to authorize the Mayor to sign an application for a permit to hold a marine event, regatta or parade from the Cal-Ore River Racers to hold the Rooster Crow Hydroplane Race on June 24-25, 2017.

♦ Approved a request from Bill Neiswanger, owner of the Cattlemen's Saloon to waive the Liquor License Application Fee required by Rogue River Municipal Code 5.15.060 for an event being held on June 23-24, 2017.

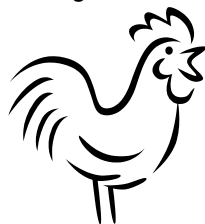
♦ Authorized the Mayor to sign an Oregon Liquor Control Commission application for Temporary Use of an Annual License from Bill Neiswanger, owner of the Cattlemen's Saloon to hold a fund raising event on June 23-24, 2017 at 108 Depot Street, Rogue River, Oregon.

♦ Approved a request from Amber Spurlock, Canteen Manager for the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4116 to waive the Liquor License Application Fee required by Rogue River Municipal Code 5.15.060 for fund raising events being held on June 17, 2017, June 24, 2017, July 22, 2017 and September 9, 2017.

♦ Authorize the Mayor to sign Oregon Liquor Control Commission applications for Temporary Use of an Annual License from Amber Spurlock, Canteen Manager for the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4116 to hold events on June 17, 2017, June 24, 2017, July 22, 2017 and September 9, 2017 at 410 East Main Street, Rogue River, Oregon.

As I sign off for this month, I'd like to share with you the speech that I prepared for the Memorial Day observance at Woodville Cemetery:

Once again, each side believes that theirs is the right and just cause and the intolerance that is being shown by all sides is alarming on so many levels. Be assured that our enemies are watching this with great pleasure and are probably guilty of some behind the scenes machinations of their own. "Divide and Conquer" is a strategy that has been used many times in history to defeat one's enemies.

I sense that we are on the brink of allowing this polarization to cloud our judgment of what is truly important - faith, community, liberty, justice. Instead, we are being blinded by greed, hate and fear and this creates fertile ground for those that would destroy our ideals.

I believe it is time for us all to remember that first and foremost, we are Americans. We don't have to all think the same or be the same, or always agree. Our diversity is one of our greatest strengths. But we can and must find common ground to do what's right for our country.

So today, as we honor those that have fought and given their lives to protect our way of life, I ask each and every one of you to embrace the responsibility that we all must share to ensure that the foundation that our country was built on does not crumble under the weight of apathy, animosity and distrust. Our fallen heroes have earned and rightfully deserve this commitment from the living."
