<u>City Council Update</u>

Mayor Pam VanArsdale opened the Regular City Council meeting Welcoming County Commissioner Colleen Roberts and her Mother Jessie along with Pastor Steve Keeton with the Calvary Chapel who delivered the Invocation.

After hearing the City Councilor's Committee Reports action was taken on the following agenda items:

Appeal: A Public Hearing was held on an appeal filed by Richard Porta with Gold River Botanicals regarding a sign permit. The Public Hearing was closed and deliberations began but the City Council needed more time to consider the applicant's request. The item was continued to the May 17, 2018 workshop for further review of City Ordinances and the final deliberations will take place at the City Council meeting on May 24, 2018 at 6:00 p.m.

<u>Appointment</u>: City Council approved the Mayor's recommendation to appoint City Councilor Ryan Hess to the Community Relations Committee as Liaison to the Rogue River Chamber of Commerce.

<u>Appointment</u>: City Council approved the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Shelli Spencer to the Council's Advisory Committee.

<u>Sponsorship</u>: A request from the Rogue River Kiwanis was approved to be a Gold Sponsor the "65th Annual National Rooster Crowing Contest" and advertise in the Rooster Crow pamphlet with a full page ad. Staff was directed to submit the artwork for the ad.

Proclamation: The Mayor read a

Proclamation declaring May 3, 2018 as the "National Day of Prayer" in the City of Rogue River, Oregon. The Mayor's Prayer Breakfast will be held on Thursday, May 3, 2018 beginning at 6:30 a.m. at the Rogue River Community Center.

<u>Proclamation</u>: The Mayor read a Proclamation declaring May 6-12, 2018 as "Municipal Clerks Week" in the City of Rogue River, and, encouraged City Recorder Carol Weir and Administrative Assistant Kailin Honea to continue their efforts with professional development and educational certification.

Proclamation: The Mayor read a Proclamation declaring May 13-19, 2018 as "Police Week & Peace Officers Memorial Day" in the City of Rogue River, expressing her gratitude for the members of our department and for their commitment and dedication of service to our community.

All meetings with the exception of Executive Sessions are open to the public and public participation is encouraged by the Mayor and City Councilors. The dates and times are located on the back page calendar and they hope to see you there.

Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day and was initiated to honor the soldiers for the Union and Confederate armies who died during the American Civil War.

Celebrations honoring Civil War heroes started the year after the war ended. The establishment of a public holiday was meant to unify the celebration as a national day of remembrance instead of a holiday celebrated separately by the



Union and Confederate states. By the late 19th century, the holiday became known as Memorial Day and was expanded to Include the deceased veterans of all the wars fought by American forces. In 1971, Memorial Day became a federal holiday.

Join the Mayor, City Council and Staff in observing Memorial by remembering those that have given their lives to protect us and protect our freedom.

Here's a little chuckle for you before I go:


