AND, IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN!!!

Fall is here and with that leaves begin to drop. We will start picking up leaves in the City on October 22nd. This service will continue through December 28th. Please call 541-582-4401 to schedule a pickup.



This is for **LEAVES ONLY**, no grass, animal droppings, tree limbs, rocks or household garbage. The City has a leaf vacuum, and would like to utilize that as much as possible. All piles of leaves should be in an area accessible within the reach of the 6-foot vacuum hose, but not behind fences, on the sidewalk or in the gutter.

Please do not rake the leaves into open ditches.



The City will also pick up leaves in bags, and if you need bags, stop by City Hall and pick up some. Remember, if you cannot pick up the bag after you have filled it, it is most likely too heavy for our employees to pick them up. Please make sure the bags are 30-pounds or less!
