✓ The certified results of the November 6, 2018 General Election were accepted by the City Council.




A properly completed streetlight outage report will help ensure a quick and accurate response to your request. Please consider the following tips when completing your form:

Nearest address – e.g.; 123 Main St.

Nearest cross street – e.g.; First Ave.

The six-digit pole number from the pole plate (if you have it).
