

City Council Update

1 - 30, 2019 promoting an Emergency Preparedness Night on April 30, 2019.

Mayor Ryan Hess opened the meeting welcoming Pastor Josh May with the Truth in Rogue River Church who delivered the invocation.

After hearing committee reports the City Council *approved* the following agenda items:

- A Resolution amending Resolution No. <u>06-1118-R</u>, to include a new job description for a Deputy City Recorder/Accounting & Administrative Assistant
- A Resolution adopting a salary range for the new position of Deputy City Recorder/Accounting & Administrative Assistant
- A Solid Waste Disposal and Landfill Capacity Guarantee Agreement between the City and Dry Creek Landfill, Inc.
- ♣ A Deadly Physical Force Plan between the City and Jackson County District Attorney's Office.
- * Ratified a request from the Miss Rogue River Scholarship Program to authorize the Mayor to sign an OLCC Temporary Use of an Annual Liquor License for Tarasco's Mexican Restaurant to serve during an event held on February 16, 2019.
- * Ratified a request from the Southern Oregon Runners to use John F. Fleming Memorial Park as a staging area to hold their Half Marathon on February 24, 2018.
- Request from Rogue River Fire District, Fire Fighter/Paramedic Andrew DeKorte to hang a banner over Depot Street from April

♣ A request from Rogue River Greenway, Ride-the-Rogue Event Coordinator, Mary Mumma to use Palmerton Park Arboretum

to hold their annual event on September 21,

2019 and waive the park reservation fees.

- ♣ A request from SOREDI for a letter of support for their efforts to create a Southern Oregon Resiliency Plan for Long Term Economic Vitality along with a commitment of \$700.
- ♣ The Mayor's recommendations of new committee appointments for 2019-2021.

How should Fats, Oil & Grease be handled at home?

To dispose of FOG properly, follow these simple steps:

- Never pour FOG into your sink or toilet
- Pour FOG into a can a coffee can works well
- Place a lid over the top
- Store it to be reused until full
- When the can is full, throw it in the trash
- When there is FOG residue in a pan or on a dish, wipe it with a paper towel before washing and throw that towel in the trash
- Also, place a strainer in the kitchen sink drain to catch food scraps and other solids, then empty the strainer into the trash

PLEASE!!! If you see anyone dumping anything into a storm drain report it immediately to City Hall or the Police Department!
